Law librarians can email you specific documents/chapters from the Westlaw, Lexis Advance, and OnLaw databases, or perform keyword searches in these databases at your request and email you the results. We may also be able to direct you to appropriate free internet resources.

For specific documents, please provide a **citation**. For search/research requests, please provide us with the **keywords** you would like us to use when searching the databases (e.g. "trust amendments") and the **type(s) of source(s)** you want us to check (e.g. case law, California practice guides, law review articles, etc.)

<u>NOTE</u>: At this time, we are unable to provide you with direct/individual access or login credentials for the databases.

## Some examples of what we can email you:

- Shepard's and KeyCite reports (please provide citation)
- Annotated Code sections
- Legal form templates from practice guides (e.g. Notice of Pendency of Action)
- California appellate briefs (we have limited access)
- Sections/chapters from practice guides/treatises (e.g. Rutter Group, Continuing Education of the Bar (CEB), Matthew Bender).

- Articles from law reviews
- Verdicts
- List of research results from a keyword search performed on Westlaw, Lexis or OnLaw.

In your request, please try to be as specific as possible with citations, section/chapter numbers, or keywords/research topic(s).

Note that there may be a delay in response time as limited staff are working remotely.
