## **Checklist- What to Bring to the Passport Appointment**

Completed Passport Application	Form DS-11 must be typed or completed in black ink. Do not sign the form.
(DS-11)	Form DS-11 can be downloaded from the <u>U.S. Department of State</u> web site.
Passport Photo	One 2" x 2" color photo taken within the last six months. Front view with a white or off-white background.
	Passport photo service is not available at the library at this time.
Evidence of U.S. Citizenship	An <b>original</b> of one of the following documents:
	<ul> <li>U.S. Birth Certificate (must include full names of both parents)</li> <li>A Certificate of Naturalization or Certificate of Citizenship</li> <li>An expired U.S. passport</li> </ul>
	A Consular Report of Birth Abroad
	Your citizenship document will be submitted with the application and will be returned to you by mail with your newly issued passport.
Identification	The identification must be current and government issued containing your signature and photograph or physical description:
	<ul> <li>A valid Driver's License or Identification Card</li> <li>A U.S. Passport</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>An official Military Identification card</li> <li>A Certificate of Naturalization or of Citizenship</li> </ul>
	You must also <b>submit a photocopy</b> of both sides of the identification.
Additional Documents	Applicants who have changed their name must provide an official copy of the Marriage License or a Court Order.
	Supporting documents are required in cases of adoption, sole custody of a minor, or guardianship of a minor.
Acceptable forms of payment	Payment to U.S. Department of State (Passport fee) must be made by check or money order.
	Payment to <b>Alameda County Law Library</b> (\$35.00 Execution Fee) can be made by check, money order, credit card or cash.
	Optional Expedite Service Fee and 1-2 Day Delivery Fees must be made by check or money order to <b>U.S. Department of State.</b>
Children under 16 years old	Both parents or legal guardian and the child must appear in person. Please see the <u>U.S. Department of State</u> web site for allowable exceptions.
	Both parents must present valid identification.
