What are optional, mandatory, and what can you do when a court form is not available?



WHAT ARE COURT FORMS

Court forms are official documents, approved or prescribed for use in legal proceedings, that contain blank spaces for required information to be filled in before filing with the court.

Request to Waive Court Fees (FW-001) Ask the court to let you file papers and receive services without paying court fees and costs because you are getting public benefits, you are a low-income person, or you do not have enough income to pay your basic needs and your court fees.

Most forms are published by the Judicial Council and used across the state, but it's also common for county Superior Courts to have one or two local forms that they require you to use." - California Courts Self-Help Guide



WHEN IS A COURT FORM MANDATORY

In California state courts, many forms are mandatory, meaning you must use them to take certain legal actions. To check whether a form is mandatory or optional, look at the bottom left corner. It will say mandatory or optional.



Review the information provided on federal court forms for more insight on how they need to be used.

LOCAL FORMS

County Superior Courts also have local forms that they may require you to use.

Federal: national court forms can be used in all federal courts. Each federal court also maintains their own local court forms.

WHAT CAN YOU DO WHEN A COURT FORM IS NOT AVAILABLE

If there isn't a form for what you need to do, you will need to write your own court papers, in the right format and follow the court's rules.
